Principal's Chat

Hi everyone,

We have had some hot weather over the last week. When temperatures are in the mid to high 30s, we open classrooms at play breaks and offer students the opportunity to play inside in the cool. There are some days where students may have limited or no play outside due to the weather conditions, as set out in our Extreme Weather Policy (available on the school website). It has been great to see the students actively engaging in different activities during recess and lunch times, with the new students exploring our yard. Lunch clubs are great for students to attend if they are finding play times difficult, are not sure what to play or who to play with or simply want to have some 'time out' inside. If you would like to encourage your child to attend the lunch clubs, we offer:

Mondays – Open club (a range of activities, plus coding)
Tuesdays – Library/Reading club
Thursdays – Lego club
Fridays – Art club

The warm weather has also allowed us to complete our 2022 swimming program. Our first session last week included some introductory activities, sorting of groups again after summer and also some try outs for the older students to enter the Division Swimming event in Bendigo. Students have two more sessions of swimming after today's session. Our 2023 Water Awareness program for all grades is booked in for December.

It was very exciting yesterday to see our Brass Band Program begin. Vinnie Bourke is teaching small groups of students from grades 3 to 6 how to play a range of brass instruments. The students all left school with their instruments and big smiles on their faces. This is a great opportunity for our students to learn an instrument, as well as be part of a community group in Maldon. If your child would like to be part of this program, please let the school know.



The Tutor Learning Initiative is in its third year and is designed to assist students who have not made the expected learning growth over the past 3 years or who need some extra support to progress. TLI students have been identified and Kirby has already started working with them. Kirby will be working on maths as well as reading, writing and spelling with students. Each student will have a personal goal, based on their assessments, and will work towards reaching their goal during the tutoring sessions. Kirby will have two sessions per week with each student in the program and should continue working with them until

Wednesday15th March School Council, 6.30pm they reach their goal. Kirby may work within the classroom with the students or sometimes they may be withdrawn from class. Kirby has ongoing discussions with classroom teachers in regards to student progress and who should enter or exit the tutoring program.

This week our whole school behaviour focus is: I am calm and in control (Be your best). In class, the students will be discussing their emotional literacy and working on things such as:

- Noticing when their body feels tense
- Practising breathing exercises to calm themselves down
- Establishing mindfulness expectations in the classroom

As a school, every day after lunch break, all classes participate in a mindfulness activity to create a calm and relaxed classroom environment for learning.

Hello from the School Crossing Team


Welcome back to a new school year!! Here are the times for the School Crossing at your school:
