October 2nd - 4th Grade 5 and 6 camp give parents/carers extra information on how their child works within the classroom. This came from feedback from our parent forum earlier in the year. Staff will continue to work on improving reporting to ensure parents/carers get an accurate picture of where their child is at throughout the school year. If you haven't already, please book in your Parent/Teacher Interview or Student Support Group Meeting on uEducateUs or phone the office for assistance.

Yesterday we did our quarterly emergency drill with the students. This term the focus was a lockdown drill. For this drill, the students, staff and anyone onsite are required to lockdown in their space and move away from any windows and doors to be out of sight. Even though these drills can unsettle students for a short time, it is very important for us to practise them. It helps show what's working well and what needs to improve. Afterwards, staff discuss the drill with students and answer any questions. All classes seemed very calm and settled throughout this process. You could discuss the drill with your child, ask them what they did and how they felt.

This week's whole school behaviour focus is: I set learning goals and strive to be my best.

Some of the areas the classes will be working on are:

- I can find my strengths and weaknesses
- I can set learning goals and personal goals
- I can make a plan to achieve my goals.

# ADHD IN SCHOOLS PARENT/CARER INFO SESSION


