On Monday grade 5 and 6 students visited Castlemaine Secondary College to get a taste of what a Science class is like in Year 7. The students were very engaged learning about liquids and observing changes when different substances were mixed together. They also enjoyed being introduced to the bunsen burner. Well done to the students for their excellent behaviour during the experience session.





On Thursday we have our Book Week Dress Up Parade. data. The tables below show the percentage of students who were in the Strong and Exceeding levels for each area. There were only 12 students in grade 3 and 9 students in grade 5 who participated in the tests, meaning that one student is worth approximately 10%. Taking into account our low cohort numbers, our 'orange' areas are only 1 or 2 students out from the similar school or network school percentages. We will use this data along, with our internal school data, to determine where our next focus areas need to be.




Permission/payments required:

4/5: Cohen for using kind words and tone when discussing important issues (be kind)


5/6: Chayse for always displaying a kind, caring manner in the classroom (be kind)
