Principal's Chat

Hi everyone,

We are in the middle of camp season at school. Last week the grade 1 and 2 students went to Boomerang Ranch Camp in Daylesford. There were lots of happy faces and horse conversations as they got off the bus on Friday! Thank you to Lauren, Jesse and Bridie, as well as parent/carer helpers, Tom, Lindsay and Jo, for ensuring a supportive and successful camp experience. Next week we have the Grade 3/4 students heading off to Anglesea for a beach camp.

Today students participated in 'Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson'. Produced annually by the Daniel Morcombe Foundation, the award-winning Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson (ABCSL) is live streamed across Australia with important safety messages aimed at junior primary (4 to 7 years of age) and upper primary aged children (8 to 12 years). This year the lessons were focused on consent. The content is age appropriate and presented in a sensitive and responsible manner. It is important to ensure that children receive explicit education on positive and respectful relationships and consent. Communication is key to giving and receiving consent. In today's lesson, children learnt how to recognise the need for consent and practice strategies they can use when they need to give or refuse consent. We understand that discussing such sensitive topics can be challenging, however we encourage parents/carers to engage with their child about the lesson they participated in today. I have included two articles to help parents/carers talk to children and teenagers about consent-


