Last week Melissa and I were asked to present our school's maths improvement journey to the DET North Western Region's School Improvement Team in Melbourne. We shared the work we have undertaken with the students around maths mindsets, including self belief, being curious and open to try new things, as well as valuing the thinking behind the maths work, not just the correct answer. After interviewing the staff and students for the presentation it showed how much of an impact our new model has had on everyone. We look forward to sharing our maths work with parents/carers next year.

Yesterday the Semester 2 reports were made available for viewing on uEducateUs. When reporting to parents/carers, teachers use all the evidence and knowledge they have gained over the semester to place every child at a level of the Victorian Curriculum. When reading through these reports, it is clear that our teachers know the children very well and ensure that they are reporting on the academic, social and emotional aspects of your child's learning. I would like to thank the teachers for their continued commitment to teaching and learning and knowing each and every student so well. It would be great if parents/carers share the report with their

child, discussing their strengths and what they have achieved, along with any areas of improvement. This year we included more Work Habits to give parents/carers extra information on how their child works within the classroom. This came from feedback from our parent forum earlier in the year. Next year we will be releasing more regular reporting to ensure parents/carers get an accurate picture of where their child is at throughout the school year.

I would like to congratulate Nicholas, Elsa, Sam, Abbey, Alex, Darien, Henry, Bill, Leon, Chayse, Maci, Zavier, Logan and Dean on their 95% attendance this year. A big congratulations to Emily, Karen and Edie who missed less than 2 days of school for the whole year. An amazing effort girls!
