Hi everyone,



This term our Social and Emotional learning/Wellbeing program focuses on the theme 'Bouncing Back'. This theme is so important, especially in today's world, where children face various challenges and uncertainties. Teachers use the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships program (RRRR) to teach children positive coping skills and problem solving skills. By emphasising positive coping strategies, children can learn how to effectively manage and reduce stress in their lives, ultimately improving their overall wellbeing. These skills not only benefit them now but also lay a foundation for lifelong resilience and improved mental health. Teaching children that there are multiple ways to solve problems is empowering. It helps build their resilience and confidence, showing them that setbacks are not roadblocks but rather opportunities for growth and learning. These sessions are taught every Monday, so please have a chat to your child about what they have been learning about.
