Principal's Chat

Hi everyone,

Despite the limited number of volunteers, our school's working bee on Sunday proved successful as we tackled various tasks to spruce up the grounds. We managed to mulch the playground, weed and trim the front garden and sweep up the leaves from the back area. While the effort was commendable, the need for more hands was clear. I would encourage greater participation in future working bees to ensure the upkeep of our large schoolyard, creating a welcoming and safe environment for the children to play each day. Thanks to Tom Robertson, Marton Gross, Kate Mahony, Newton Hunt and Ray Stevens, as well as Martha and past students Stella and Isla for their work on the day. Our next working bee is set for October and we would love to see as many families attend as possible.

Last week we held our School Council Meeting for May. Kim Saddlier (Senior Education Improvement Leader for our Network) attended the meeting to inform the School Council that Jodie Mengler has relinquished her principal position at Maldon Primary School. With this notification, the substantive principal position for Maldon Primary School has now been advertised and we are hopeful that the position will be finalised for the start of term 3.

Yesterday we held an Emergency Evacuation Drill. We plan for and practise different types of evacuations such as Shelter in Place, Lockdown, Onsite Evacuation and Offsite Evacuation. It is important for all staff and students to be familiar with these evacuations, to practise them to build confidence in an emergency situation and to identify any areas for improvement. This evacuation was focused on a lockdown scenario, where all students were locked into their classroom space and were required to shelter quietly out of sight of windows and doors. The students all navigated the drill very well. We always have a brief discussion with the students after the drill which includes what to do if you are at the toilets/outside when the alarm rings, what the expectations are of every student and staff member and why these drills are important. Students always have great questions or comments in this debrief. Staff will now review the processes and we will make adjustments to our Emergency Management plan as required.
