## **Principal's Chat**

Hi everyone,

We've experienced quite a variety of weather over the past week which, unfortunately, led to the postponement of our Athletics Carnival last Friday. We appreciate the support of the parent volunteers who had already signed up to help on the day. If you are available to assist on our rescheduled date of Friday, August 30th please let us know. We still require at least six more parent helpers.

Yesterday we conducted an onsite evacuation drill at the school. It was a highly successful practice with everyone assembled at the basketball court and the roll call completed within three minutes of the alarm sounding. The students handled the drill efficiently and the majority remained very calm. After each drill we review the process with both students and staff and have additional discussions with students who may find such drills unsettling.

This week's whole school behaviour focus is: I speak with kindness (be kind). This value follows on from last week's 'Say No to Bullying' Day.

Students have been working on showing the following statements:

I can use a pleasant/friendly tone even if I disagree

I am mindful of my body language

I think about my words and how they could make others feel

I use my voice to stand up for others

I am respectful and confident

I use positive self talk

## Something which may interest our families...

We now have the state and national data from the 2024 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assessments. While our focus is mainly on the analysis of our own school's results, it is timely to share some key statewide outcomes. Overall, the 2024 Victorian results are again very pleasing, especially at the primary level

## Data snapshot

Victorian education outcomes - NAPLAN 2024







Victoria's NAPLAN participation rate this year was the highest it has been since the first year of testing in 2008.



#### Victorian Year 3 Students

Victorian Year 3 students continue to lead the nation in reading and numeracy – the third year in a row in which this has been achieved.



#### **Reading Performance**

Victorian students in Years 3, 7 and 9 **improved on their 2023 reading results**, reversing the national trend, which saw the average score for reading decline in Years 3, 5 and 7 and improve only at Year 9.

Victoria's reading performance **improved overall in 2024**, with 5, 000 more students reaching the 'exceeding' proficiency level for reading across all year levels compared to 2023.



#### Victorian Primary School Students

Victorian primary school students continue to produce the best results in the country, ranking first or second in 8 out of 10 domains – more than any other state or territory.



#### **Reading and Writing**

Victoria achieved the first or second highest mean scores of all jurisdictions in 7 out of 8 measures in reading and writing and achieved the top results in the country for writing in Years 5, 7 and 9.



We also need to lift outcomes for our secondary students.
