Principal's Chat

Hi everyone,

Welcome back to school for the last term of the year! I would like to welcome back Sharyn Morrice, our Japanese teacher. Sharyn has returned from Long Service Leave and will be back teaching Japanese to the students this Wednesday. Thank you to Carmen Bunting for filling in during Sharyn's absence. This Thursday the grade 1 and 2 students head off to Boomerang Ranch in Daylesford for their overnight camp. This camp is always a highlight for the students and they take away lots of precious memories, especially about the horses that they ride. We will share some photos with you next week.

Over the term break we undertook lots of work around the school to update the building. The hallway flooring was replaced, new air conditioning/heating units were installed in all rooms and a wall and door were constructed between the Grade 5/6 classroom and the teacher resource room.

This week's whole school value focus is: I am responsible (all school values). This focus is to help students get back into the routines of school. Some of the areas classes will focus on are:

Establishing class routines and responsibilities

I can set myself up for learning (book box, diaries, managing belongings etc)

At school, all classrooms display a daily visual timetable for students to help prepare them for the day ahead. Change happens all the time and is unavoidable. Teachers prepare students as much as possible when routines change, such as telling students if they are going to be away or showing students new environments online before visiting them (ie. camp grounds) to build children's confidence in coping with change. 30 students in grades 4-6 completed this survey earlier in the year. The results show that all but one of the factors were positively endorsed by students equal to or higher than similar schools, schools in our network and the State average. This survey represents a single data point collected on one day, helping us evaluate our school's progress. Even so, we are VERY proud of the results.

We rated lower than similar schools, schools in our network and the State average in only one factor, Community Connections. I have included below the questions students were given which related to this factor.

<u>Community Connections</u> (Response options were: Not at all, one time, two times, three times, four times, five times or more)


Thinking about how you spend your time after school and on the weekend, in the past 2 weeks did you:

- Participate in organised sports (such as football, hockey, netball, basketball, dancing)
- Participate in an interest group or hobby with others (such as music classes, language classes, art group, gaming, skateboarding)
- Hang out with friends

Even though the factor we rated lower in is based on out of school connections, the school can still work towards improving this. One way of doing this is through our Clubs program which allows students to participate in community groups and foster connections that could develop into future sports or hobbies for them.
