I notice the strengths and achievements of others and acknowledge them


I notice when someone may be having trouble and offer to help them

On Friday students will be participating in activities for 'Day for Daniel'. 'Day for Daniel' is an annual event in Australia dedicated to raising awareness about child safety and protection. It honours the memory of Daniel Morcombe, a young boy who was abducted and murdered in 2003. The day encourages schools, communities and families to participate in activities that promote safety education, empowering children to recognise and report unsafe situations. It also aims to foster discussions about the importance of vigilance and the collective responsibility to protect children. This builds on the 'Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson' we held on 3rd September. It would be wonderful if everyone could add a 'splash' of red to their uniforms on Friday to help recognise the day. Next week we will share some of the activities from the classrooms.



This year, more parents and carers have also positively recognised Student Voice and Agency, which is further supported by the Attitudes to School Survey completed by students in grades 4 to 6. Students are regularly encouraged to provide feedback and take ownership of their learning.

It's encouraging to see that parents and carers feel that Positive Transitions have improved as well. Our staff collaborate to ensure that students feel supported throughout the year, across different classes, and during transitions to new teachers. Grade 6 students participate in an online 'Set for Secondary' course in term 4, while kindergarten children visit our school several times throughout the year, with multiple visits in Term 4.

We welcome and encourage any feedback on these survey results, as the survey plays a vital role in helping us enhance our programs and support for students and families.
