Principal's Chat

Hi everyone,

Last Friday was 'Day for Daniel', a special day following on from the **Biggest Child Safety Lesson we did in National Child Protection Week** last term. This special day honours the memory of Daniel Morcombe and aims to educate students about safety strategies and the importance of protecting themselves in various situations. Throughout the day, students engaged in age-appropriate activities that focused on safety awareness, including discussions about trusted adults, recognising safe and unsafe situations and how to seek help when needed. Our teachers and staff emphasised the significance of being aware of one's surroundings and making safe choices. We encourage families to continue these conversations at home and reinforce the safety messages shared at school. Together, we can help empower our children to stay safe and make informed decisions. Last week we held a practice evacuation drill where all staff, visitors and students were required to evacuate the building and walk to the Bill Woodfull Recreation Reserve in their class groups. All students listened carefully and moved in a calm manner. We undertake these drills at least once per term to ensure that everyone knows what to do in an emergency and to give staff an opportunity to review our processes and make any necessary improvements.

Today we go off to a range of community groups for our third session of our Clubs Program. Here's what some of the students think about the program so far...

Violet (prep) - I'm doing cooking and we get to cut things and mix things. I love that you get to eat the food. I made some of the cookies for my cousin's birthday party.

Beau $(gr\ 1) - I$ like going to the art gallery. We have been making cards using stamps and now are making flowers. I've already made two flowers. I like going to the art gallery.

Zayde (gr 2) – I'm doing lawn bowls for Clubs. We get in groups and do different activities. I've never done lawn bowls before, so I'm learning new things.

Harry (gr 3) – I like that my mum is running the cooking club. It's a good life skill to learn and also will help if we do it as a subject at high school.

Nicholas (gr 4) – Croquet is fun. I like doing the games. I learnt that you have to hit the ball through 3 wickets before you try to hit the pole. I'm reasonable at the game, but getting better.

We have also been researching about rights, responsibility and privileges and discussing which ones are the most important. The students have also been doing their own mini project on a topic of choice with the theme Democracy.


MATHS - FUN WITH FRACTIONS! - DEAN
